18.2a. Strike out the first chart after the rule (example of Numbers 11:18) and SUBSTITUTE the following chart:

E.g.	Deuteronomy 1:14 וַתֹּאמְרוּ טוֹב־הַדְּבָר אֲשֶׁר־דִּבַּרְתָּ And you said, "The thing that you said is good."

18.2c. In the table in this section, make the following two corrections:

In the last cell on the left, strike out the two descriptive sentences ("In this case . . . *substantive.*")

In the second Hebrew entry on the right, change סוּל = > being

Independent subject pronouns

18.3a. In the list of uses of independent subject pronouns, in item 3 change $\text{t\o{p}icalize}$ = > *emphasize*

ADD the following paragraph as the last paragraph of the section:

Note that examples (1) and (4) *require* a pronoun (or noun) to make a grammatical statement. Thus, there is no emphasis on the pronoun. On the other hand, for examples (2) and (3), a pronoun is *unnecessary*; its presence indicates some kind of emphasis or focus on the pronoun. The exact emphasis or focus must be determined from the context of the particular clause.

18.3b. Make the following change In the chart of independent pronouns:

(2 f. p.) אֲתָנָה = > אֲתָנָה

Irregular nouns

18.4. Make the following changes in the chart of irregular nouns:

In the singular with 2nd m. s. suffix row: אֲבִיךָ = > אֲבִיךָ אֲחִיךָ = > אֲחִיךָ

In the plural with 2nd m. s. suffix row: $\text{בְּנֵי־יִשְׂרָאֵל} = > \text{בְּנֵיָם}$

EMEND the section heading: ~~*Discourse profiles for Predictive Narrative and Instructional Discourse*~~ = > *Predictive Discourse and Instructional Discourse*

18.5a.

18.5b. Strike out from the beginning of the section through the last line of the chart (“8. Irrealis . . .”).

In the last paragraph (“Note:”), strike out the first part of the first sentence (“As you can see . . . distinguishing”) and SUBSTITUTE “Distinguishing”.

In the rest of the paragraph, change ~~Predictive Narrative~~ = > Predictive Discourse (3 ×)

18.5c. Strike out the last sentence of the paragraph (sentence starting “The Direct Speech genres . . .”) and the chart that follows.
